This past year was extremely challenging as the nation experienced multiple hurdles and hopefully is on a course to overcome the grips of a global pandemic. On the positive side, out of the ashes of the global shutdown, creative opportunities helped develop new ways to provide education, meetings, and conduct business in the virtual world. NCOPE was no different.

In keeping with the new mission statement, "Improving lives and strengthening the profession through education", NCOPE with the help of many contributors, developed an incredible video library to help students and residents maintain their educational knowledge. 




Reflections on COVID-19 and NCOPE's Response


March 2020 and the arrival of COVID-19 became an unprecedented health and economic crisis for our O&P community, our country and our world.

As the O&P profession's accreditation organization, working in cooperation with the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Programs (CAAHEP), the NCOPE Board of Directors and staff were resolute in our commitment to respond quickly and as accommodating as possible to our stakeholders. Starting in mid-March, the NCOPE executive committee begin meeting once a week to review, discuss, and identify any issues that the educational programs, residency programs, and residents may have been experiencing as well as the impact on our programmatic services.

The NCOPE leaders and staff provided the following resources, tools, and responses:

- Developed and published a Public Statement on COVID-19

 due to COVID-19.

- COVID-19 Guidance for Orthotic, Prosthetic, and Pedorthic Students and Educators
 - Creation of an Educator Resources Database that provides access to O&P educational content, including videos. Individuals required to register to gain access. Available to Faculty from CAAHEP accredited O&P programs.
 Online Registration Form
 - Creation of a graduate preparedness form. Completed by the program director, the tool is designed to capture information from academic program faculty to inform residency directors/mentors and future employers on the training and abilities of students who have had their education affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. The goal of this form is to provide input regarding an entire cohort of students affected by COVID-19 and compare/contrast their education to previous cohorts not affected by the pandemic.


